Since 1995, MICS has supported countries to
generate data on children, women and
households, helping shape policies for the
improvement of their lives.

MICS is now the largest source of comparable
statistics on children, women and households
worldwide.



SINGLE LARGEST SOURCE OF HOUSEHOLD SURVEY-BASED SDG INDICATORS

Of the 232 SDG indicators, 80 can be sourced
from household surveys.

**MICS includes 33 SDG indicators under
11 different goals: nearly half of all
household survey-based indicators.**

Topics range from poverty, health, education and
hunger to gender, labour and justice.

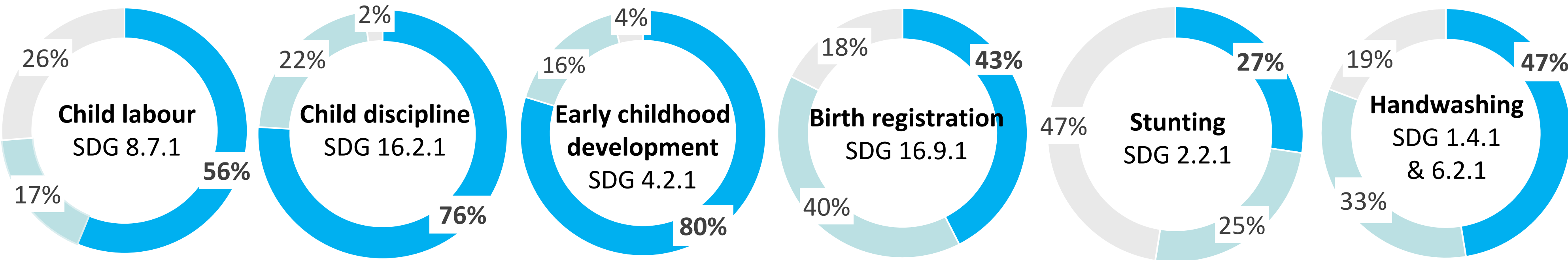
